



The Department of Social Work (DSSW), University of Delhi, and International Association of Schools of Social Work (IASSW) will jointly convene an International Capacity-Building Workshop on **January 16, 2025**, at the University of Delhi, Conference Centre.

The theme of the Workshop is, '*In Pursuit of Sustainable Futures: Perspectives from Social Work*'. The Workshop will involve the participation and presentations by eminent scholars and academics in social work from India and abroad. Social work academics from different countries will participate in the Workshop. The event shall provide profound insights into emerging perspectives in the field of social work and will offer a great opportunity for cross-cultural dialogue. This event promises to be an exceptional platform for deepening our collective understanding and fostering innovative approaches to social work education and practice.

This capacity-building workshop focuses on sustainable futures from a social work perspective and aims to explore the role of social work in shaping sustainable development. Through a multi-faceted approach, the discussions will focus on advancing social work education, research, and scholarship to address global challenges, forging synergies between India and global sustainability goals. The subthemes given to the capacity building workshop include:

- Building Stronger Communities: Indigenous Knowledge in Social Work Education and Practice
- The SDG Journey: Global Dialogue and Local Action
- Welfare Systems: Learnings from Emerging Models
- Global Partnerships, Collisions and Collaborations

The workshop seeks to develop indigenous and sustainable solutions through active engagement and dialogue among social work professionals, addressing pressing global social, economic, and environmental challenges. By incorporating insights from practice, policy, and education, the workshop highlights social workers' pivotal role in fostering a resilient, equitable, and inclusive future for India and the world. This will involve discussions with academics from several schools of social work worldwide, representing regions from the USA, UK, Europe, Asia, Africa, and Latin America. Additionally, strategies for enhancing collaboration and networking through mutual exchange of ideas will be revisited and refined.

The workshop is pivotal as the University of Delhi is internationalizing its curriculum and implementing the NEP 2020 framework. It plays a crucial role in integrating global, intercultural, and international dimensions into the university's teaching and learning approach.

IASSW is a global organisation representing schools of social work and educators, with members in over 70 countries across all continents. IASSW has a membership of 409 schools of social work, 160 individual members, other life members, and associations. The workshop will facilitate the exchange of ideas and foster future collaborations in social work education, research, and scholarship among faculty and student participants. A key outcome of the panel discussions will be the creation of a policy brief or document aimed at advocating for the advancement of social work scholarship and practice.
